

# LEADERSHIP DELIBERATION REPORT

## Community Order & Infrastructure Protection Program Theme: Let Community Lead

Date: April 12, 2026.  
Adagom 1 Settlement, Ogoja, Nigeria

---

### Section 1 — Background

Adagom 1 Refugee Settlement, like many growing communities, has experienced gradual challenges affecting shared infrastructure, particularly **road encroachment** caused by farming activities and environmental growth.

Over time, several vehicle access roads have become narrowed, affecting:

- Transportation movement
- Sanitation activities
- Emergency access
- Environmental maintenance

These challenges highlighted the need for a **structured, community-led approach** to restore order and protect shared infrastructure.

In response, a **Leadership Deliberation Meeting** was convened to align key stakeholders and define a practical way forward.

### Section 2 — Meeting Objectives

The deliberation meeting was organized to:

- Introduce the NEVOR Circle Foundation (NCF) to settlement leadership as a structured support system
  - Discuss the Community Order & Infrastructure Protection initiative
  - Agree on a collective, leadership-driven implementation strategy

## Section 4 — Key Resolutions

A **Leadership Resolution Document** was adopted and signed by participating leaders, confirming their commitment to the initiative.

## Section 5 — Program Launch

The program was formally introduced during the forum through a **symbolic and practical approach**.

### Boundary Stick Ceremony

Each Community Leader received a **boundary marker stick**, representing:

- Commitment to community responsibility
- Protection of public roads
- Leadership accountability within their communities

This symbolic act reinforced ownership and alignment among leaders.

## Section 6 — Implementation Plan

The program will be carried out through three structured phases:

### Phase 1 — Preparation

- Identification of community volunteers
  - Cutting and preparation of boundary sticks
  - Painting and marking of boundary sticks

### Phase 2 — Road Mapping

- Identification of road boundaries within communities
  - Placement of boundary sticks and caution tapes
  - Clearing of obstructed road paths
- 

### Phase 3 — Documentation

- Recording of mapped road sections
  - Documentation of community participation
  - Collection of visual records (photos and reports)
